2022 CISM 3x3 Basketball Championship

The 2022 Conseil International du Sport Militaire (CISM) 3x3 Basketball Championship was held in Warendorf, Germany 3-10 Jul 22. Both male and female service members from four of the six services (Army and USMC not represented) arrived in Ramstein on 2 Jul 22 for a trial camp.

Coaches' Commander Micah Bonner (USCG) and TSgt James Lewis (USAF) put players to the test with the intent of further refining skills that would come in handy in the Championship play ahead.

This first-ever World Military Basketball 3x3 Championship featured 19 international teams pitted against each other with the finals taking place in front of a jubilant audience. Lithuania pulled the big "W" for the Men's Championship, and host nation Germany took gold for the Women's Championship.

Employee Transfer Assistance Program (ETAP)

Great news!! Child & Youth (CY) team members have an exciting program developed by the Department of the Air Force (DAF) to better assist those who are relocating to another DAF installation outside of the employee's commuting range. This voluntary employee transfer assistance program (ETAP) is for all Air Force nonappropriated fund (NAF) employees in CY-I and CY-II, 1702 series positions. ETAP allows eligible employees to request a non-competitive transfer and upon approval, the employee will be placed without a break in service into a position at the same grade, series, pay (unless the gaining installation pays more), and employment category from which they left. Participants in ETAP are also eligible for a cash incentive award, after 90 days in the position at their gaining installation (while funds are available)!

To be eligible for this opportunity, employees:

- must be a current CY program assistant in a 1702 series position (either regular or flexible),
- must have no adverse actions within 12 months of initiating transfer request,
- must be eligible and authorized to work in the United States,
- and must agree to be placed on leave without pay (LWOP) for 6 months to 1 year while pending placement, although it is possible to be placed sooner.

Registering for ETAP is simple. Interested employees should inform their immediate supervisor of their intent to apply for ETAP and reach out to their local NAF HR team for information on the program and registration guidance. Employees should be prepared to provide an updated resume with their current position listed. Please share with your caregivers that they can continue to serve Airmen and Guardians wherever the mission may take them!
