Air Force Golf Recognition Program – “Excellent in Everything We Do Everyday”

The Air Force Services Center's Air Force Golf Program staff developed a recognition program for Air Golf Courses. Yokota AB's Tama Hills Golf Course was selected for the recognition. The course opened as a 9-hole course in 1969 and was expanded by military and civilian volunteers to 18 holes. One of the top courses in the Air Force, it celebrates its 50th Anniversary this year.
