Department of the Air Force Family Child Care Provider Recruitment and Retention Initiatives

The Department of the Air Force is recruiting for Family Child Care (FCC) Providers at all AF and USSF locations. FCC providers offer child care to children and youth from 2 weeks to 12 years of age in homes located on or off installation that have been certified by the Mission Support Group Commander. One of the hallmarks of the FCC program is its ability to tailor the types of care offered to virtually fit every schedule, deployment or special need. In order to ensure this critical child care program is offered across DAF, additional FCC providers are needed and a recruitment initiative (pay) is being provided until Sept. 30.

All providers meet stringent training requirements (to include CPR/First Aid), complete background checks to include applicable household members, are inspected regularly, are state
