Peterson Garrison Campus Dining System Update

Peterson Garrison is the third installation to initiate the new Campus Dining System (CDS). Under the CDS test, active duty Air Force Essential Messing (ESM) members have expanded benefits using a portion of their daily ESM entitlement in participating Nonappropriated Fund (NAF) activities.

The Air Force is the only branch of the service to deliver Campus Dining which allows the Air Force Services Center manage/support both appropriated fund and NAF food and beverage (F&B) operations using the same technology systems. It is also the only branch of service to manage all F&B operations using an ala carte system, allowing the individual member to select only what they desire, similar to a college and university Campus Dining System, using their Common Access Card.

Peterson Garrison along with Mountain Home Air Force Base, Idaho, and Hurlburt Field, Florida, are three of six installations currently testing CDS. Maxwell AFB, Alabama, Misawa AB, Japan and Incirlik AB, Turkey will implement and test CDS in the next four months. If successful, the Air Force is seeking the funding to deliver CDS to the rest of the Air Force starting in FY22

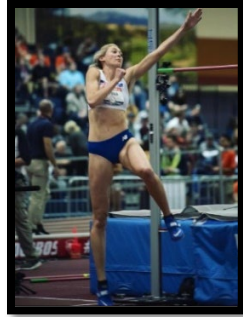
- Female Athlete of the Year: Capt Amber Hansen, NASIC

Child Development Program Child Care Fees – School Year 2021-2022

Department of the Air Force and HAF/A1S issued new Child Care program fees for School Year 2021-2022 which will take effect Aug. 15. Parent fees have been adjusted for increases in direct care staff hourly wages. The fee policy increases the number of family income categories from nine to 13 and the hourly care fee increases from \$5.00 to \$7.00 per hour. High market fee rates are pre-approved at the following locations: Beale AFB, California; Buckley SFB, Colorado; Davis Monthan AFB, Arizona; Eglin AFB, Florida; Fairchild AFB, Washington; Hanscom AFB, Massachusetts; Hurlburt Field, Florida; JB Anacostia-Bolling, Washington, D.C.; JB Andrews, Maryland; JB Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska; Los Angeles AFB, California; Luke AFB, Arizona; MacDill AFB, Florida; Nellis AFB, Nevada; Scott AFB, Illinois; Travis AFB, California; and Vandenberg AFB, California.

Virtual High School Expanded Eligibility Pilot Program

In partnership with local education agencies, the Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) released a new National Defense Authorization Act required program aimed at expanding eligibility for dependents of members of the armed forces on active duty. The program is available to students entering grades 9-12 for the 2021-22 school year and includes homeschool students. Currently the students must be residing or inbound to the following installations: F.E. Warren AFB, Wyoming; Vandenberg AFB, California; Edwards AFB, California; Beale AFB, California; Travis AFB, California; Mountain Home AFB, Idaho; Whiteman AFB, Missouri; McConnell AFB, Kansas; Tinker AFB, Oklahoma; Grand Forks AFB, North Dakota; Minot AFB, North Dakota; Ellsworth AFB, South Dakota; Hill AFB, Utah; Eielson AFB, Alaska. Students can take up to two courses from a selection of more than 30 courses (includes Advanced Placement, World Languages, Career Technical Education). The application window is currently open. The program is currently under review for potential expansion to non-DoDEA locations. The School Liaisons at the pilot selected locations are trained and able to assist families regarding eligibility and requirement criteria.

DoDEA Pilot Program to Expand Eligibility for Enrollment at Maxwell Elementary and Middle School

DoDEA expanded Pilot Program eligibility for dependents of members of the armed forces on active duty stationed at Maxwell-Gunter. This National Defense Authorization Act required four-year pilot program is aimed at expanding eligibility for dependents of members of the armed forces on active duty that do not reside on Maxwell-Gunter and do not currently meet the attendance zone requirements. The pilot program is available to students entering grades K-8 for the 2021-22 school year. The application window is open and remains open throughout the school year with students enrolling prioritized using the Maxwell Elementary and Middle School Cascade developed by DoDEA and Team Maxwell.

Air Force Entertainment (AFE) - 2021 Virtual Performing Arts Camp

The Air Force Services Center (AFSVC) is excited to host two virtual performing arts camps for teens 15-18, looking to boost or learn vocal and performing skills. AFSVC will select 40 participants for each camp (July 12-22; August 2-12). The AFE staff received input from several music educators and highly experienced performers in developing the camp curriculum. Four highly qualified instructors/coaches will conduct daily one-on-one sessions, webinars, live group seminars and personal performances in front of peers. Each attendee will leave the camp with a professionally mastered recording of them singing a song of their choice.

DAF Central Ticket Program - Disney Ticket Connection

The Air Force Services Center's Central Tickets program team is transitioning from a prepaid Disney paper ticket program to a direct platform known as Disney Ticket Connection (DTC). Installations will use plastic ticket shells, similar to gift cards, activated on demand. The ticket shells hold no value until swiped through the magnetic reader to load and activate. The transition is in two phases, based on the geographical location and typical volume of Walt Disney World tickets sold. Phase 1 began June 2021 at MacDill AFB, Eglin AFB, Florida, Patrick AFB, Florida, Robins AFB, Georgia, Ft Gordon, Dobbins ARB, Georgia, Wright Patterson AFB, Ohio, Scott AFB, Illinois, Tinker AFB, Oklahoma, JBSA-Lackland, Texas, Luke AFB, Arizona, and Camp Pendleton. AFSVC anticipates Phase 2 (remaining installations) beginning mid-July 2021.
