Campus Dining System (CDS)

The Air Force Services Center implemented CDS at Misawa AB, the first overseas location and the fifth of six bases as part of the non-Food 2.0 CDS pilot. Under the CDS pilot, installations operating with a legacy dining facility concept can expand healthy food options by allowing active duty Essential Station Messing (ESM) members to use their entitlement at participating Non-Appropriated Fund (NAF) activities.

Other CDS pilot locations include Mountain Home AFB, Hurlburt Field, Peterson SFB, and Maxwell AFB, with plans to implement at Incirlik AB in the Aug/Sep 2022 timeframe. If successful, the Air Force will seek funding to deliver CDS to the rest of the Air Force starting in FY24.

The Air Force is the only branch of the service uniquely structured to deliver Campus Dining, as both appropriated fund and NAF Food and Beverage operations managed and supported with the same technology systems at AFSVC.

Crosswinds Dining Facility (DFAC) Opening

Crosswinds DFAC at Nellis AFB opened its doors on 5 May 2022 after closed for 2.5 years, while undergoing a \$6.4M renovation to transition to the Food 2.0 feeding concept. The renovation included a complete upgrade of both the serving and dining areas, in addition to much-needed infrastructure improvements.

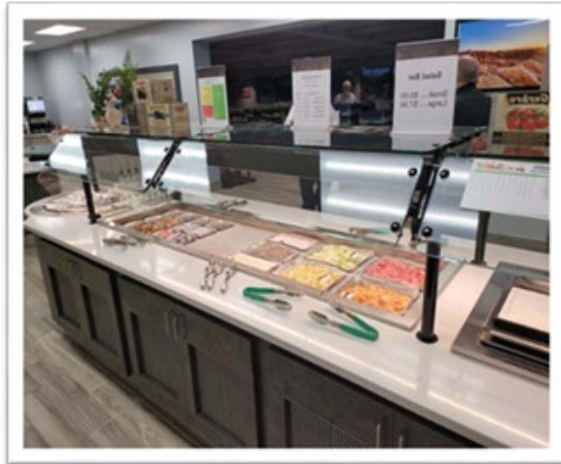
Nellis is the 27th location to undergo transformation from the Air Force and Space Force traditional legacy model to Food 2.0 since 2008. The transition to Food 2.0 from the legacy concept changes whom can eat in the Nellis DFAC with active duty personnel, retirees, TDY personnel, civilians, reservists, and children and spouses all authorized. The Food 2.0 DFAC provides a sense of community while adding a wide-variety of healthier menu options.

The DFAC offers midnight, breakfast, lunch, and dinner meals Monday through Friday, along with brunch and dinner on weekends and holidays. DFAC guests can browse through a variety of menu option stations to include entrée, pizza, sub/deli, global, salad bar, fruit and yogurt bar, N'Rich Grill, and Simply-To-Go.

Essential Station Messing also have access to Campus Dining, which enables eligible Active Duty permanent party ESM personnel assigned to Nellis to eat at one of the many NAF Food and Beverage operations on base, as an extension to the Crosswinds DFAC.

Campus Dining options include the mobile food truck and trailer, The Atrium, Pit's Pints and Burgers, and Robin's Roost located in the Club, Rickenbacker's located in Lodging main building, Second Cup, Champion's Café and Champion's Grille at the Golf Course.

Hangar 97 Dining Facility (DFAC) Opening

The Hangar 97 DFAC at Altus AFB, OK reopened on 28 Apr 22 after a 13-month renovation. The \$4.6M renovation included installation of three hood vent systems, a new fire suppression system, and upgraded power and HVAC. Altus previously transitioned to Food 2.0 concept in 2016 so anyone with access to the installation can eat at the DFAC, including military retirees, TDY personnel, contractors, civilians, Reservists, and military family members. Hangar 97 provides a sense of community, while adding a wide variety of healthier menu options to Team

Altus. Guests can choose from a variety of options to include Big City Grill, Super Sonic Subs, Entrée Line, Ciao Pizza, Quick Eats, Breakfast Bar, and Salad Bar. Essential Station Messing (meal card holders) also have access to Campus Dining, which enables eligible Active Duty permanent party ESM personnel assigned to Altus to also eat at one of the NAF Food & Beverage operations on base, as an extension to the Hangar 97 DFAC.



FORCECON 2022



FORCECON was a weeklong gaming, technology and innovation expo held 24-29 May 2022 at the Tech Port Center and Arena in San Antonio. Industry, academia and government agencies had a chance to connect and collaborate about installation and mission support and observe the

first-ever Armed Forces Esports Championship.
